AWARD CEREMONY

AWARDS



Article 58 - Eliminated horses shall be deprived of any award earned up until that moment and shall be granted to the horses holding the next position, if and when this is possible. Should that not be possible, said award shall be considered unclaimed.

Article 59 - In each section, at least the following Awards shall be granted:

1. Champion of the Section, gold medal and/or trophy.
2. Reserve Champion of the Section, silver medal and/or trophy.
3. 3rd place in the Section, bronze medal and/or trophy.
4. Award for Best Movement (B.M.).
5. Award for Functionality (M.F.) when appropriate.

At each competition, the rosettes (ribbons) and/or diplomas shall be granted by the Organization Committee together with the Awards. The Organization Committee may grant as many Awards and Honorary Mentions as deemed appropriate.

The Awards for Best Movements in a given section shall be granted to the horse competing in Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 with the highest score, once the scores for walk, trot and canter have been tallied.

A Functionality Award for sections 7-8, 9-10, and 11-12 have been established for the mare or stallion that obtains the highest score in the Functionality Test, from among the finalists in the sections for the same age group.

Article 60 - At all competitions the following Special Awards shall be offered:

1) **BEST BREEDER AWARD** - Any breeder seeking the Best Breeder Award shall ensure the following requirements:

- a) All horses presented at the Competition, seeking this Award, shall have been bred by that breeder with his/her breeder code. Nevertheless, this award may be sought by those stud farms which have been divided, whatever the reason may be, although those horses have different breeder codes, if and when those horses have descended from the same family tree or from business groups of that same breeder. In both cases, the horses shall have been transferred to the new stud farm in the year of the division and without intermediate changes.
- b) The horses shall be owned by said breeder.
- c) Present horses in at least four (4) different sections in which a brood mare shall be presented in any of Sections 7, 9 or 11, a stallion in any of Sections 8, 10 or 12, a young mare in either Section 3 or 5, and a young stallion in Sections 4 or 6.

Presenting a Cobra in Section 13 is optional and not a mandatory requirement for this award.

The Best Breeder Award shall be granted to the stud farm that scores the highest mathematical average of the four (4) horses with the highest scores obtained in their section, of all the horses presented by that stud farm.

In those cases in which a breeder participates in more than four (4) sections, the four (4) bibs belonging to different sections and that have the highest score as indicated in this Article shall be taken into consideration. The ANCCE IT app shall automatically select the best scores for the final tally towards the Award. The scores obtained by each horse shall depend on its place and the section where it participates, based on the table in Appendix III, to which additional points shall be granted towards the Special Awards:

- Mare/Stallion Champion: 5 points
- Colt/Filly Champion: 4 points
- Functionality Champion: 3 points
- Adult Champion of Movement: 3 points
- Youngstock Champion of Movement: 2 points
- Reserve Mare/Stallion Champion: 3 points
- Reserve Colt/Filly Champion: 2 points
- Reserve Champion of Functionality: 2 points
- Reserve Youngstock Champion of Movement: 1 point

The horse earning a Special Award shall continue to be considered a single horse, when the division is made.

Those horses which, having been entered and accepted for this Award and that failed to appear in their Section or that were disqualified, whatever the reason may be, shall tally points based on the table in Appendix III.

Section 13 is included in the mathematical average calculation but as voluntary participation; therefore, the final tally includes the direct points established in Appendix III added to the stud farm's total. The breeder may present as many Cobras as deemed appropriate, but only the Cobra with the highest score shall be tallied up with the points earned towards the Best Breeder Award. The same holds true for any other Sections included in the tally.

In the event of a tie, this shall be resolved in favor of that Stud Farm which has:

1. Placed highest in the Section for 3-mare Cobras (Section 13).
2. Presented the highest number of horses for the Best Breeder Award.
3. Presented a mare in the Functionality Test.
4. Presented the highest number of stallions in the various Sections.
5. Presented the highest number of mares in the various Sections.

The horse earning a Special Award shall continue to be considered a single horse, when the division is made. Those horses which, having been entered and accepted for this Award and that failed to appear in their Section or that were disqualified, whatever the reason may be, shall tally points based on the table in Appendix III.

Section 13 is included in the mathematical average calculation but as voluntary participation; therefore, the final tally includes the direct points established in Appendix III added to the stud farm's total. The breeder may present as many Cobras as deemed appropriate, but only the Cobra with the highest score shall be tallied up with the points earned towards the Best Breeder Award. The same holds true for any other Sections included in the tally.

In the event of a tie, this shall be resolved in favor of that Stud Farm which has:

1. Placed highest in the Section for 3-mare Cobras (Section 13).
2. Presented the highest number of horses for the Best Breeder Award.
3. Presented a mare in the Functionality Test.
4. Presented the highest number of stallions in the various Sections.
5. Presented the highest number of mares in the various Sections.

2) RESERVE BEST BREEDER AWARD - The Reserve Best Breeder Award shall be granted to the stud farm that has earned the second-best score from among the participating stud farms seeking this award.

3) BEST EXHIBITOR AWARD – The Best Exhibitor Award may be sought after by those breeders who enter horses owned by that Stud Farm, although all or some of the horses entered were bred under another breeder code.

To seek this Award, the participating breeder shall enter horses in at least five (5) different sections, of which it is mandatory that at least one broodmare be presented in any of Sections 7, 9 or 11, as well as a stallion in any of Sections 8, 10 or 12, a young mare in Section 3 or 5, a young stallion in Section 4 or 6 and another horse, other than any of the previously mentioned.

Entering a Cobra in Section 13 is voluntary, and not an essential requirement to earn this award.

The Best Exhibitor Award shall be granted to the stud farm that scores the highest mathematical average of the five (5) horses with the highest scores obtained in their section, from among all the horses presented by that stud farm.

In those cases in which a breeder participates in more than five (5) sections, the five bibs from the different sections will be taken into consideration as indicated in Section C of this Article. The ANCCCE IT app shall

automatically select the best scores for the final tally towards the Award.

The scores obtained by each horse shall depend on its place and the section where it participates, based on the table in Appendix III, to which additional points shall be granted towards the Special Awards:

- Mare/Stallion Champion: 5 points
- Colt/Filly Champion: 4 points
- Functionality Champion: 3 points
- Adult Champion of Movement: 3 points
- Youngstock Champion of Movement: 2 points
- Reserve Mare/Stallion Champion: 3 points
- Reserve Colt/Filly Champion: 2 points
- Reserve Champion of Functionality: 2 points
- Reserve Youngstock Champion of Movement: 1 point

The horse earning a Special Award shall continue to be considered a single horse, when the division is made. Those horses which, having been entered and accepted for this Award and that failed to appear in their Section or that were disqualified, whatever the reason may be, shall tally points based on the table in Appendix III.

Section 13 may be included in the calculation, but on a voluntary bases; therefore, the direct points as established in Appendix III are added to the total earned by the stud farm after having applied the mathematical average. A breeder may enter as many Cobras as deemed appropriate, but only the best classified shall be taken into consideration when tallying the points for the Best Breeder Award, as is the case with any other computable section.

In the event of a tie, the same criteria used for the Best Breeder Award shall be applied.

4) STALLION CHAMPION AND RESERVE STALLION CHAMPION – This winner shall be chosen from among those placing 1st and 2nd in Sections 8, 10 and 12, and as indicated below:

- This test shall be scored by all of the Conformation Judges, who shall evaluate the horses standing still. Whenever there are two panels of Judges, those in the championship must perform the movements performed in their Section.
- The horse in first place from each of the Sections indicated shall stand in the center of the arena. Those placed second shall remain at one end of the arena.
- The judges shall then proceed to compare the three (3) horses that placed first in their corresponding Sections.
- Each Judge shall award three (3) points to the horse he/she considers to be the best, two (2) points to the second best and one (1) to the third.
- The Chief Steward shall tally the points given by each of the judges. The Champion shall be the horse with the highest number of points.
- Subsequently, the Champion Stallion shall go to one end of the arena; his place shall be occupied by the horse that placed second in the Section. The Reserve Champion shall then be chosen by comparing him with the two other horses that were already in the arena, as indicated above.
- In the event of a tie, the Judges shall vote once again, only scoring the two tied horses, giving two (2) points to the horse considered the best and one (1) point to the second.
- If there continues to be a tie, the deciding vote shall be used.

5) MARE CHAMPION and RESERVE MARE CHAMPION - The Mare and Reserve Champion shall be chosen from among those placed 1st and 2nd in Sections 7, 9 and 11. The Mare Champion and Reserve Champion shall be elected using the same procedures established for the Stallion Champion and Reserve Stallion Champion.

6) COLT CHAMPION and RESERVE COLT CHAMPION - This Award has been established for the two (2) horses in Sections 4 and 6 that have the highest classification. From among these, the Colt Champion and Reserve Colt Champion shall be chosen, following the same procedure used for the Stallion and Reserve Stallion Champion.

7) FILLY CHAMPION and RESERVE FILLY CHAMPION - This Award has been established for two (2) horses placing first in Sections 3 and 5, from which the Filly Champion and Reserve shall be decided. The procedure shall be identical to that established for the Competition Stallion and Reserve Champion.

8) ABSOLUTE FUNCTIONALITY CHAMPION AND RESERVE FUNCTIONALITY CHAMPION - The Functionality Champion Award shall be granted automatically to the horse that has obtained the highest score when performing this test, and from among all of the participants in the sections for stallions and mares, based on the age groups (Sections 7-8, 9-10, and 11-12). Likewise, the Reserve Functionality Champion shall be the horse that obtains the second highest score.

In the event of a tie, the winner shall be for the horse with the highest score on the Conformation score sheet, including movements in-hand. Should the tie persist, the winner shall be the horse with the best score for in-hand movements and as a third option, the vote among the Judges. If the tie still persists, the deciding vote shall be used.

9) YOUNGSTOCK and ADULT CHAMPION OF MOVEMENT AWARDS - Awards have been established for Best Movements, based on the age of the horses: Youngstock and Adults. In both cases, the horses shall perform double the laps when being judged in their section.

- **Youngstock Champion and Reserve Youngstock Champion of Movement:** Horses that were the winners as Best Movements in each of the Sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 may compete. These Champions shall compete against each other for the Youngstock Champion of Movement Award. Each Judge shall score the horse granting 3, 2 or 1 point/s, to the horses which in his/her opinion, has performed the best paces. The horse earning the most points shall be considered the Youngstock Champion of Movement (abbreviated as YCM) and the second best will be considered Reserve Youngstock Champion of Movement (abbreviated as RYCM). In the case of a tie, the horses involved shall perform a repeat itinerary, the same as performed initially, and the Judges shall once again vote the best among those involved in the tie. Should the tie persist, the deciding vote shall be used.

- **Adult Stallion Champion of Movement:** Horses that earned the title as Best Movements in each of Sections 8, 10, and 12 may compete for this award. These Champions shall compete against each other, by comparison, for the Adult Stallion Champion of Movement Award in hand, using a points system. Each Judge shall score the horse granting 3, 2 or 1 point/s, to the horses which, in his/her opinion, have performed the best paces. The horse earning the most points shall be considered the winner. In the case of a tie, the horses involved shall perform a repeat itinerary, the same as performed initially, and the Judges shall once again vote the best among those involved in the tie. Should the tie persist, the deciding vote shall be used.

- **Adult Mare Champion of Movement:** Horses that were Champions of Movement in each of Sections 7, 9, and 11 may compete for this award. These Champions shall compete against each other, by comparison, for the Adult Mare Champion of Movement Award in hand, using a points system. Each Judge shall score the horse granting 3, 2 or 1 point/s, to the horses which, in his/her opinion, have performed the best paces. The horse earning the most points shall be considered the winner. In the case of a tie, the horses involved shall perform a repeat itinerary, the same as performed initially, and the Judges shall once again vote the best among those involved in the tie. Should the tie persist, the deciding vote shall be used.

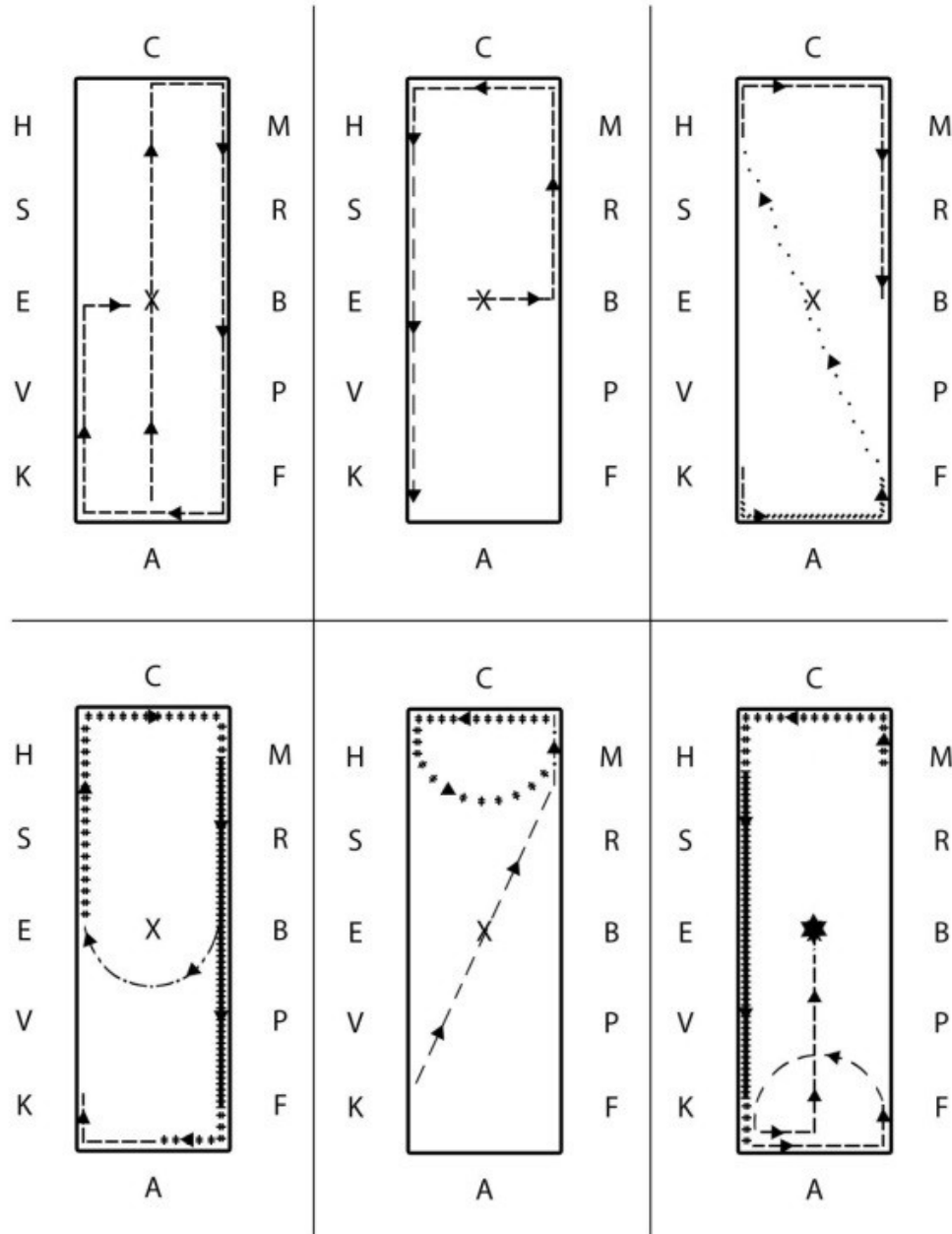
Article 61 - All horses qualifying for the Special Awards must appear in the arena to be judged. In the event that a winning horse fails to appear to be judged for any of the Special Awards—independently of the reason—it shall be disqualified, thusly leading to the loss of any and all acquired rights and said horse shall be considered serious misconduct, when not justified. If this were the case of the first-place winner, the second-place winner shall take that horse's place and shall be judged with the other horses in first place. Should the no-show horse have qualified second in its Section or be the horse with Best Movements, substitution shall not be allowed.

Article 62 - The Organizing Committee shall announce the schedule and location of the Awards Ceremony on the Competition Program. Attendance is mandatory for any horse earning an award.

In the event that a winning horse fails to appear to receive its Award, a written authorization from the competition veterinarian, the owner shall lose that Award and there shall be no winner. Said owner runs the risk of losing the rest of the Awards earned by his/her participating horses at that Competition, as established by the Organizing Committee, without prejudice of disciplinary measures that may be adopted by the Competition Commission as set out in the present Rules and Regulations.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Proper attire will be required of all exhibitors.
- All domestic animals (dogs and cats) must be securely tied, caged, in a closed stall, or on a leash held by a responsible person at all times while on the show grounds or in the stable area. No dogs allowed in warm up arenas.
- Sharps Containers: are located on the road side of barns. Management may fine for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments is \$100, imposed on any individual, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents.
- No smoking is allowed in the barn areas or in any buildings at World Equestrian Center. Anyone found smoking in the barn area will be fined \$100.
- Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being exercised, walked, or ridden.
- Fly hoods/ear covers are permitted for Functionality classes
- Show Office Hours: TBA
- Hospitality: Food available on site during show hours.
- Show Fines: The following fines will be enforced by the show on all exhibitors, competitors and spectators in violation of local rules: Loose dog/cat without leash: \$100. Smoking in the barn area: \$100. Improper disposal of medical or hazardous waste: \$100.
- Farrier and Veterinarian: on-call numbers will be posted in the barns and the secretary office.
- Motorized Vehicles: are only allowed on access road
